Music Notes ~ Catholic Behind Closed Doors

This week at our 11:15 am service, the offertory is “Ave Verum” by William Byrd (1543-1623). William Byrd and Thomas Tallis had an exclusive license to print music from Queen Elizabeth I, a significant achievement for the Renaissance composers. Although Byrd moved to Essex to make secret contact with Roman Catholic groups, he continued to serve the Anglican church openly while practicing his Roman faith privately. Byrd was fined for not attending Anglican services. His response was to write two Latin motet collections demonstrating his commitment to the Roman Catholic faith, probably not the response the authorities expected or hoped for. “Ave Verum” was written for secretive Roman Catholic gatherings, where professional singers weren’t available. The music is relatively simple, with some homophonic texture (where all singers sing the same syllable at the same time). And it happens to be Fr. Todd’s favorite piece of choral music! ~ Dr. Brett Judson, Director of Music

Word of the Week

Our word of the week is [fraction anthem](#). The fraction anthem is said or sung after the fraction, or the breaking of the bread. We often use one of the standard fraction anthem texts, like Pascha Nostrum (<https://www.episcopalchurch.org/glossary/pascha-nostrum-christ-our-passover/>) or [Agnus Dei](#), but we also use some of the other approved fraction anthem texts found in the Hymnal, like “The disciples knew the Lord Jesus in the breaking of the bread.”
