Music Notes ~ Organ Music for a Department Store

The week's prelude is "Fanfare & Procession" by Keith Chapman (1945-1989). Chapman was known for his long tenure as organist of Wanamaker's Department Store of Philadelphia, which has the largest fully functioning pipe organ in the world. As a Californian, Chapman spent much of his time in San Francisco and Grace Cathedral, where he studied with Richard Purvis and served as Assistant Organist. Chapman composed many works on well-known tunes so that shoppers at the department store in Philadelphia would be delighted with music they knew, especially during the holidays. "Fanfare and Procession" is unusual in this respect since it is not based on a well-known melody. The middle of the work features a regal solo on the tuba stop with a walking bass line. Throughout, there is a rhythmic drive and colorful harmonies, leading to a climactic ending ~ Dr. Brett Judson, Director of Music

Proceeds from this fundraiser go to Heifer International. Last year we donated close to \$1,000 to Heifer International – that's equivalent to one sheep, two alpacas, one heifer, and one goat for families in need.

Flowery Delivery Volunteers

Every Monday, the Flower Guild breaks down the altar flowers into smaller arrangements and delivers them to parishioners and others. For several years, the bulk of the delivery work has been done by one or two people, and it's not as easy for them as it used to be. So we're starting a new ministry of flower deliverers, a great way to connect with people, brighten their day and let them know they're thought of and prayed for, and serve the Church. The Flower Guild will break down the flowers by noon on Mondays, and you'll come into the office and pick up the flowers and the delivery address. We hope to have enough volunteers that each person needs to take only one arrangement. Caldor Fire Donations

If you would like to make a donation to help those affected by the Caldor Fire, you can give it to the church – please mark it “fires.” We will collect the money and give it to the

El Dorado Community Foundation's Caldor Fire Fund as they begin making grants to folks whose primary residence suffered 25% or greater structural damage.

Helping Afghan Refugees

We continue to collect items to support Afghan refugees settling in the greater Sacramento area, in particular, [dry food kits](#), [bathroom kits](#), and [kitchen kits](#). Parishioners with relatives from the Middle East recommend Kabul Bazaar Meat Market at 640 E Bidwell St. in Folsom for food kits—good prices, a locally owned business, and the rice in particular is more like the rice in Afghanistan. All donations can be dropped off in the Parish Hall, and monetary donations can be dropped into the offering plate or directed to the church office (please include a note that your donation is for Afghan refugees). A huge thank you to all who have donated already! We've been able to provide several dozen food kits, bedding sets, and car seats, and many other items including Chromebooks; bike helmets, locks, and lights; towel sets; and Farsi-English dictionaries.

Word of the Week

Our word of the week is [ablutions](#). We do some ablutions at the altar here (the finger washing, for example), but Fr. Todd is of the opinion that one needn't wash the dishes at the dinner table, so it's better to which off the veiled chalice and paten after Communion and clean it in the sacristy.
