Stephen Ministry

Music Notes ~ Stretch Those Legs on the Pedals

This week's prelude is "Andante in C" by Samuel Sebastian Wesley (1810-1876). Samuel Sebastian (S.S.) Wesley is not to be confused with his father, Samuel Wesley. S.S. Wesley is the grandson of Charles Wesley. S.S. Wesley's middle name was selected because of his father's love of music by Johann Sebastian Bach. S.S. Wesley composed a substantial body of musical literature for the Church of England; you probably know one of his most popular hymn tunes, "Aurelia," which is paired to "The Church's One Foundation." Trinity choir has sung a few of his choral anthems, "Wash me thoroughly" and "Lead me, Lord," for example. Both S.S. Wesley and Henry ("Father") Willis, the foremost English organ builder of the Victorian era, are credited with having created the concave organ pedalboard, something that is universally utilized in the United States. Historically, pedalboards were flat, making the distance from the lowest to highest notes rather large and cumbersome. The concave shape of the pedal board helped to bring the lowest and highest notes closer to the player to facilitate ease and flexibility. ~ Dr. Brett Judson, Director of Music
