## Music Notes ~ The Great English Improvisor

This week's prelude is "Quasi lento: teneramente" by Herbert Howells (1892-1983). Howells was a celebrated English composer and organist who is credited with a great body of Anglican church music. Though his family had significant financial challenges when he was younger, Howells was able to manage organ lessons with Herbert Brewer of Gloucester Cathedral. He continued to receive a formidable education at the Royal College of Music with teachers such as Charles Stanford and Hubert Parry. Through his compositions, Howells commemorated his son's untimely death at nine years old. One of those commemorations is the widely sung hymn "All my hope on God is founded," with the tune named after his son, "Michael." "Quasi Lento: Teneramente" is from Six Short Pieces for Organ. As organist of St. John's College, Cambridge, Howells was known for improvising at the organ, never playing from any written scores. ~ Dr. Brett Judson, Director of Music
