Meet Your Vestry



Kim Hewitt was born in upstate New York, but since her father was in the Air Force, she grew up all over and considers herself a New Englander, since both of her parents were from Massachusetts and she went to high school there. Kim studied chemistry at Randolph-Macon Women's College (now Randolph College) in Virginia, and then went on to the University of Pittsburgh for a master's degree in chemistry. Though she had originally intended to become a forensic chemist, she changed directions and took a job selling equipment to forensic laboratories. This change in direction brought more than a new career; at this job, she met Clark Hewitt, and they married in 1981. Kim has worked in sales and consulting at IBM for the past 37 years and currently leads business efforts with the state of California. Kim was widowed in 2010, and four years ago, she moved to Sun City in Lincoln and passes two other Episcopal churches to get here on Sundays.

Kim's mother was a Congregationalist and her father, who usually comes out here for the major holidays and worships with us, is a Roman Catholic; Kim was raised as a Congregationalist, but her family wasn't very active in church. Clark was an Episcopalian, and when their son Ross was born, they decided to start going to church, attending an Episcopal church in Connecticut, and when they moved to Granite Bay in 1991, they started coming here to Trinity Folsom. Kim joined the Altar Guild right away when they started coming here and has been a member ever since, even during times when she hasn't been as active in other parts of church life; she was director of the Altar Guild from 2000 until 2010, and also served on vestry before as senior warden. During that time of service on the vestry, Kim, who shares the Thrift Shop volunteers' passion for supporting outreach, helped to redirect the Thrift Shop proceeds to outreach and was involved in a reorganization and reinvigoration of the Thrift Shop, its work, and its community, and it's one of the accomplishments of which she is proudest. Kim is currently on the vestry, having been appointed to fulfill the term of someone who resigned for health reasons. Outside of church, Kim has been involved for fifteen years with the United Way California Capital Region, focusing on collective impact, and currently serves on its Board of Directors. She's also a longtime supporter of Muttville Senior Dog Rescue.

You'll find Kim in the pews at the 7:30am service almost every Sunday. "It is absolutely a priority for me; I love the liturgy, the listening, the reciting...and because of my experience on the Altar Guild and just the community of the congregation, I love this church." She is amazed at how much it has changed in her time here, and is thrilled by the parish's "vibrancy, the energy, the enthusiasm of the congregation." Kim wants the church to remain strong, and, most importantly, to "remain open to whatever God calls us to do, and that we hold each other accountable for this continuing to be the place that we all want it and need it to be."
