Music Notes ~ A British March

This week's postlude is "Allegro marziale e ben marcato" from Six Pieces by British composer Frank Bridge. Bridge is perhaps best remembered as the first composition teacher of Benjamin Britten, one of England's most beloved composers from the 20th century. However, Bridge's own compositional output

is substantial, though largely unknown. A student of Charles Stanford at the Royal College of Music in London, Bridge was well respected both as a composer of chamber music and as a concert violist. He taught Britten to play the viola as well. Bridge wrote several keyboard works, including this lovely set of six pieces, which includes "Allegro marziale." ~ Dr. Brett Judson, Director of Music
